Tuesday, July 19, 1988

Prices were sharply higher on yolks, about unchanged on the balance. Trading activity was slow in developing as most buyers were out of the market. Difficulties, due mainly to extended periods of hot weather, continued to pose the most severe problems. Floor stocks were generally in good balance to handle current buyer interest.

Hot weather over a broad area continued to reduce rate of lay, egg size and quality. Retail movement slowed from prior week in some areas while demand was fairly good in other areas especially where features were in progress. Some breakers resisted higher prices for heavy weight breaking stock by reducing schedules.
