## FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn futures closed lower from 3/4 of a cent to 8-1/2 as heavy long liquidation going into the close stressed prices. Late weakness was attributed to weather forecasts calling for milder temperatures along with increased rain probability. Further pressure was linked to lower basis levels and a bleak near term export outlook. December closed out the day at \$2.87 after trading as high as \$3.01-1/2 earlier in the day.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybeans closed mostly higher today, with the front two options 2 cents lower and unchanged. Prices bounced around throughout the session with gains

made on ideas the market had become oversold and losses occurring on profit taking. Thoughts of heavy delivery notices this Friday pressured the spot month, while some weakening was seen late in the session on updated weather forecasts predicting cooler temperatures and increased rainfall.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures settled higher from 5 to 1-1/4 cents this afternoon, but off session highs as sharply lower corn and falling soybean prices began to pressure wheat. Strength on the opening was attributed to news that China would be bidding on 500,000 MT of soft red export bonus wheat, with commercials

buying throughout the day prompting ideas that the bid had been accepted. December closed today at \$3.75, after posting a high of \$3.81-1/2 and a low of \$3.69-1/2.

**ACRES CATTLE UPDATE:** Live cattle closed nicely higher this afternoon with gains of 48 to 97 points while feeders closed from 30 to 125 higher. Strengthening cash fundamentals paired with active fed cattle trade at higher prices supported along with speculation that midday quotes would trend higher. Spillover from live cattle and strong technicals boosted feeders, with the August closing 125 points higher.
