MASTER MIX FEEDS & DR. WALT KENNETT, DAIRY NUTRITIONIST AT OUR CAMP HILL PLANT, RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING DROUGHT FEEDING OPTIONS:

INVENTORY FEED SUPPLIES

Take into account both quantity and quality. Store to allow feeding access to various quality forages.

ALLOCATE FORAGE SUPPLIES

To all production and age groups. Feed highest quality forages to high producers to allow for maximum intake and health, reserving some for young calves. Rations for lower producers, dry cows and older heifers can be balanced using lower quality forages and forage substitutions.

BALANCE FEEDING PROGRAMS

For all groups. Only a completely balanced program will give optimum economic performance be it milk production or growth.

PURCHASE SUPPLEMENTAL FEEDS

On a needed nutrient basis. Ask for detailed nutrient printouts. Examine them closely; ask hard questions. Don't purchase nutrients you don't need.
