

# Adams Co. 4-H/FFA Market Swine, Sheep Show

**GETTYSBURG (Adams)** — The fifth Annual Adams County 4-H/FFA Market Swine and Sheep Show and Sale was held at the South Mountain Fairgrounds. It was a successful conclusion for 35 members of both organizations who have worked hard this spring and summer getting their animals ready for show.

The Grand Champion Lamb was shown by Mandy Hilbert, Littlestown. The 125 pound lamb was bought by Gettysburg National Bank for \$2.50 a pound, a sale record. A trophy was presented in honor of the 4-H/FFA Sheep Program by an anonymous donor. Mandy was also Reserve Champion Jr.
