**ARENTDSVILLE (Adams)** — The Adams County 4-H Dairy Club held its project Round-up Saturday, August 6 in conjunction with the Adams County 4-H Fair held annually at the South Mountain Fairgrounds. Doing the judging this year were: Thomas Dum III, Landisburg, type judge; Mel Durboraw, Gettysburg, fitting judge; and Tim Brown, Littlestown, showmanship judge. Senior member Christine Todt

picked up a fistful of blue ribbons exhibiting both the junior and reserve junior champions in the Holstein competition. Chris's intermediate calf, Todtdale Baltimore Rebel Sheri, took the top honor while her intermediate yearling Todtdale Brady Dynamo Juliet stood reserve. Chris also was selected as both the show's champion fitter and champion showman. Chris is currently serving as the Club's president. Denton Guise also had a blue ribbon day winning both the senior

and reserve senior titles in the Holstein breed. His dry 2 year old, Buttonwood Columbus Sybil, was named senior champion and his 3 year old, Buttonwood Joe Eloise captured the reserve title. Denton was also selected as the Reserve Champion Fitter of the show. In the colored breed competition Joy Hess showed the champion Brown Swiss, a senior 2 year Old Quiet Valley King Kathi.
