ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures today closed lower but off session lows on renewed buying tied to export rumors and spillover strength from the soybean pits. Pressure throughout the day was exerted by increasing supplies of free stocks due to 9-month loan program redemptions. The USDA announced after the close a sale of 158,496 Metric tonnes to unknown destinations. Generic certificate bids weakened 1/2 percent today. September corn closed at \$2.84-3/4, down 2-1/2 cents after trading to a low earlier in the session of \$2.78.

SOYBEAN ACRES **UPDATE:** Soybeans today closed mostly higher gaining from 1/4 to 15 cents on rallying bean oil

prices. Oil was supported throughout the session by talk that Pakistan would soon re-enter the market, which was complicated further by news that the President of Pakistan was killed in an airplane crash. Beans are desperately seeking fundamental news to try to continue the upward push and remained locked in a trading

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures today closed from 1/4 cent higher to 1-1/2 cents lower rebounding from session lows. Strength late in the session was tied to spill over from the soybean and corn pits as export interest began to emerge. Corn futures weakness dropped wheat prices as

much five cents early in the ses-

sion. September closed out the day at \$3.90-1/4, down 1/4 cent, after trading to a low early in the session of \$3.85-1/2.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle and feeder cattle futures closed higher this afternoon gaining from 20 points in the feeders to as much as 130 points on the October live cattle. Continued cash fundamental strength and active boxed beef movement ignited a short covering rally after a mixed to lower opening. Pressure early in the session was tied to limited buying interest after a hefty increase in open interest yesterday, with the futures discount to cash providing early support.
