ACRES NEXT DAY OUTLOOK: cash -steady futures-steady.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed from 22 points lower on the spot option to 63 points higher on the December option. Deferred strength was attributed to spillover strength from the cattle pits and the futures discount to cash. Product weakness early in the session limited buying interest which was offset by light selling interest due to the thoughts of decreased slaughter figures from triple digit temperatures. The spot option was pressured late in the session by expectations for increased receipts tomorrow due to moderating temperatures.
