West End Fair Youth Livestock Sale Held

LAURELTON (Union) --- The Union County West End Fair held its 10th annual 4-H and FFA Livestock Sale on Friday, August 5. The sale was open to all FFA and 4-H members in Union County exhibiting animals during the 63rd annual fair. Each county FFA and 4-H member with livestock proects could exhibit up to 1 steer, 2 hogs, and 2 sheep at the fair. Byron K. Imes of Port Royal served as the auctioneer. A total of 71 market animals were sold for a total of \$15,701.09.

The 1,305-pound grand champion market steer was owned by Miss Union County, Amy Cotner.

Amy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Cotner of Lewisburg. The Charolais steer was purchased at the New York Feeder Cattle Association sale in Angelica, N.Y. The steer was purchased by B & K Meats of Mifflinburg for \$1.18 per pound.

The 1,210-pound reserve champion market steer, owned by Curtiss Falck of Lewisburg, was purchased by Keister's Middleburg Livestock Auction for \$.79 per pound.


In the market swine division, Kayse Moyer of Mifflinburg showed the 245-pound grand champion market hog. The

His 158-pound Suffolk lamb was purchased by Sunset Ice Cream of Williamsport for \$2.40 per pound. The reserve champion market lamb, owned by Rebecca Dietrich of Mifflinburg, was purchased by Northeastern Farm Credit Service of Lewisburg for \$2.02 per pound.

This year's sale included a total of six steers, 42 market hogs, and 23 market lambs. The steers sold for a total of \$5,838, the market swine \$7,306.37, and the market lambs \$2,556.72.
