Youth Project Loan Offered By FmHA

CLEONA — Farmers Home Administration, a division of the United States Department of Agriculture, has youth project loans available for operating credit to young people.

Future farmers/entrepreneurs between ages 10 and 20, who live in the open country or in towns of less than 10,000 population may borrow money for income-producing projects that will give them experience in operating their own enterprises.

Only projects of a modest size can be financed and must be a part of an organized and supervisory program, such as 4-H, Future Farmers of America, and similar organizations.

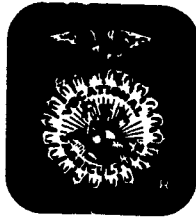
Projects, such as lawn and garden service, livestock and crop production, repair shops, catering services, crafts sales or roadside markets, must be planned and operated with the help of the organization advisor, who also must approve the loan.

Eligibility will be determined by the local FmHA County Committee. Purposes for the loan may be

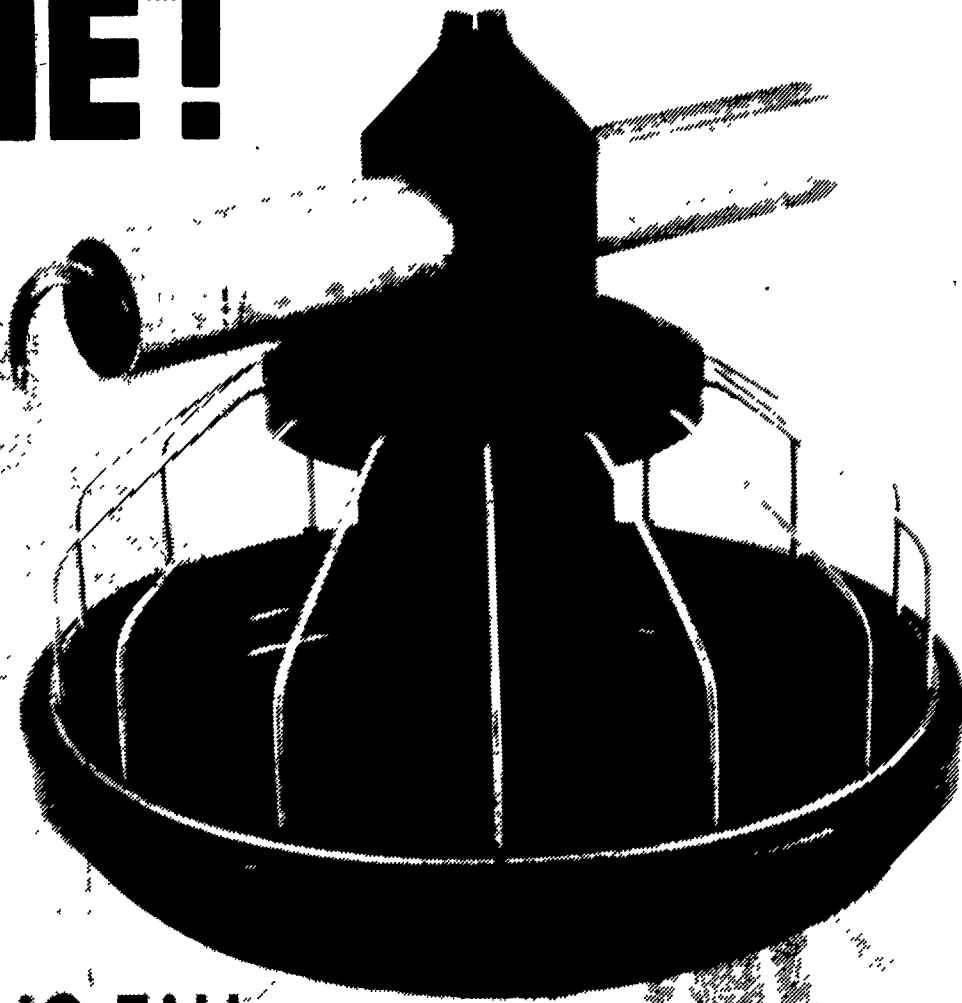
to buy animals, equipment and supplies; buy, rent or repair needed tools; pay operating expenses.

The interest rate is 9 percent. Loans may be made from one to seven years, for a maximum amount of \$10,000.

Presently FmHA is out of these funds but that should not deter an individual from applying, because we expect funds for this program in the near future.
