Claysburg Farm Show

The 58th annual Claysburg Community Farm Products and Flower Show will be held Monday, September 12 through Thursday, September 15 in the Claysburg-Kimmel elementary gymnasium. Exhibits may be entered on Monday, September 12 from 2:00 until 9:00 p.m.

This year the Claysburg Farm Show will participate in a statewide apple pie contest. The overall apple pie winner will be eligible to compete in the state farm show in Harrisburg in January. Pies will be judged for crust, filling, overall appearance and sensory qualities, as well as creativity. The outstanding pie will receive a blue ribbon and money on the local level.

Judging will take place on Tuesday, September 13 at 8:00 a.m. This year's judges will be as follows: needlework- Christine Schrifft from Hollidaysburg; arts and crafts- Joan Stern from Roaring Spring; baked goods and canned goods- Joyce Brumbaugh from Duncansville; flowers- Toni Bilik from the Agricultural Extension Office in Hollidaysburg; and

vegetables- Robert Hetrick from the Agricultural Extension Office in Hollidaysburg. A plaque will be awarded to the top prize winner in each department.

Exhibits will be open to the public September 13 through 15 daily until 9:00 p.m. Exhibits may be removed after 9:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 15. All exhibits must be claimed by 10:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 15.

A bake sale will be held Tuesday, September 13 at 8:00 p.m. All baked goods will be auctioned off by Frank Brumbaugh, a local auctioneer.

The 1988 Claysburg Farm Show Queen will reign over this week of the farm show. The Farm Show Queen Contest will be held on Friday, September 9 at 7:30 p.m. in the Claysburg-Kimmel High School gymnasium. All CK junior and senior girls will be eligible to compete for the title of Claysburg Farm Show Queen. Once again the contest will be sponsored by the Claysburg Rotary Club in conjunction with the Claysburg Farm Show Committee.

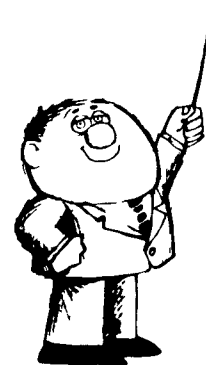
