

FFA South Central District Dairy Show

REDLION (York)—The 1988 South Central District FFA Dairy Show was held at the Shippensburg Fairgrounds on August 5, 1988. The type judge for the show was Chester Raught of R R 1, Elverson, Pa. The fitting and showmanship judge was Steve Corman from R D, Carlisle, PA. Eighty animals were exhibited from Adams, Cumberland, Franklin, Perry, and York counties.

The Junior Champion and Grand Champion of the Brown Swiss breed was Pine Gill Jubilation Honey, an intermediate yearling shown by Jennifer Gloss of the Chambersburg FFA, Franklin County.

In the Guernsey breed, Grand Champion and Senior Champion honors went to four year old Lilac Springs Jamaica Reba owned by Paul Rauhauser of the Dover FFA, York County. The Junior Champion and Reserve Grand Champion, junior calf Lilac Springs Mel Romona, and the Reserve Junior Champion, Lilac Springs Mel Arlene, a summer yearling were also shown by Paul Rauhauser.

In the Jersey breed competition, Grand and Senior Champion honors went to a two year old, Reich-Dale Top Brass Bambi shown by Brian Reichard of Blue Ridge

FFA, Franklin County. Reserve Grand and Reserve Senior Champion was Top-O-Hill Keystone Toffee, a nine year old cow shown by Mary Ellen Deaven of Chambersburg FFA, Franklin County. Junior Champion honors went to a senior yearling, Pleasant Valley Deni Hazel shown by Christopher Reichard of Blue Ridge FFA, Franklin County and Reserve Junior Champion was senior yearling Mar-De Karl Taffy shown by Mary Ellen Deaven.

The Milking Shorthorn breed Junior Champion and Grand Champion was a junior calf, Three Springs Jean, exhibited by Mark Brantner of the Chambersburg FFA, Franklin County.

The Senior Champion and Grand Champion of the Holstein breed competition was the four year old cow, Latimore Defiance Jo, shown by Janet Ludwig of the Bermudian Springs FFA, Adams County and the Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champion was junior two year old Chesdale Astro Roliant Simon shown by Christopher Reichard of Blue Ridge FFA, Franklin County. The Junior Champion Holstein of Dennis Weller of the West Perry FFA, Perry County was senior calf Weller Brownking Saul Suc and the

Reserve Junior Champion was O'Toole-Acres Landslide Madonna, a senior yearling shown by Robert O'Toole of West Perry FFA, Perry County.

The Ayrshire breed Grand Champion and Junior Champion was a junior calf, Honeybrook Comet Doris, shown by Mary Ellen Deaven of Chambersburg FFA and the Reserve Grand Champion and Reserve Junior Champion was junior yearling MRK E-Z Win Saydra entered by Michael Hensel of the Shippensburg FFA, Cumberland County. The Senior Champion of the Ayrshire show was senior two year old Primrose Flashy C Snowgirl shown by Lewis Branter II of Chambersburg FFA, Franklin County.

In the Bred and Owned classes, Paul Rauhauser of the Dover FFA received first with his Guernsey four year old, Lilac Springs Jamaica Reba. Michael Daugherty of the Conococheague FFA, Franklin County received top honors with his Holstein junior two year old, Dar-View Wiseman Renita. Brian Reichard was the winner of the Jersey breed competition with his junior two year old, Reich-Dale Top Brass Bambi.

York County won the County

Good Housekeeping award and the Kennard Dale FFA of York County received the individual chapter Good Housekeeping Award.

In the selection of county groups, the first place group of four animals of the Holstein breed was exhibited by Franklin County and the first place group of the Jersey breed was also shown by Franklin County.

Champion Fitter honors went to Dennis Weller of the West Perry FFA, Perry County and Champion Showman competition resulted in the selection of Janet Ludwig of the Bermudian Springs FFA of Adams County. The champion fit-

ter received a show halter and the showman received a show blanket which were presented on behalf of Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc. by Art Staver of R D 1 Shippensburg.

Attending the show and providing assistance by presenting ribbons and awards were Cumberland County Dairy Princess, Christine Davidson and alternate dairy princess Joan Glesner also of Cumberland County. Special thanks were expressed to the many businesses and individuals who donated their time and/or money toward the success of the show.

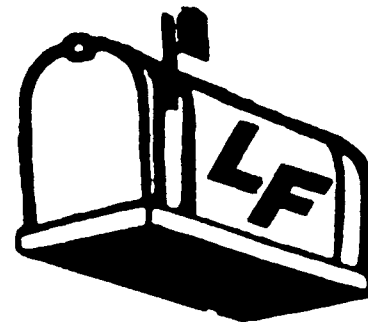
