### Acres Corn Update

Corn futures today settled unchanged on the May option to 1 cent higher on the December option. Support today came from a solid export line up coupled with 350,000 MT of corn sold to the USSR with further bids expected from Portugal and Taiwan. Further support was attributed to concerns over potential additional damage to the crop from the effects of Hurricane Gilbert. Generic certificate bids were steady today with bids ranging from 97-1/2 to 99-1/2%

### Acres Soybean Update

Soybean futures closed mostly higher today, but well off session highs boosted by the prospect of further damage to the crop from the effects of Hurricane Gilbert. Expectations for harvest delays added to the buying momentum along with firmer European values. November closed up 4-1/2 cents at \$8 93-1/2 after touching a high of \$8 98 earlier in the session.

### Acres Wheat Update

Wheat futures closed higher again this afternoon, gaining from 2 to 3 1/2 cents on buying generated by ideas of additional export bonus business in the very near future. Follow through buying was seen this morning on yesterday's strong closes. December traded to a high of \$4 29 and closed at \$4 28-3/4, up 1 cent on aggressive professional buying.

### Acres Cattle Update

Live cattle futures closed higher from 10 to 25 points on cash connected buying and late commercial short covering. Positioning in front of Friday's cattle on feed report, which is expected to show record August marketings was featured. A slight increase in fed cattle trade fueled additional buying with large gains limited by concerns of heavier weights and sluggish fed sales the past several weeks. Feeders closed from 50 to 68

points higher, with fears of adverse weather striking Texas.

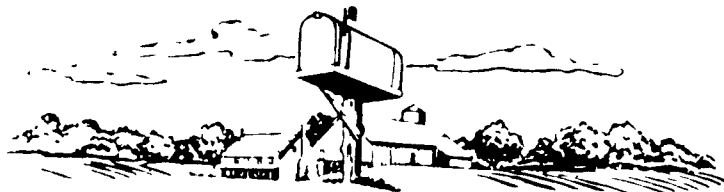
