Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair overall. Supplies were no more than adequate on the 2 1/4 lb. sizes, ample on heavier sizes. In the parts complex whole breast were in good to tight balance. The remaining items were generally fully adequate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at *56 to 68* cents; however, sharp discounts were noted on some 3 lb. and over sizes. Live supplies were moderate. Weights ranged light to heavy, mostly heavy. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. The undertone was steady overall.

Cutlets were fully adequate at 2.35 and spot trading in half and full loads were noted at 2.25 and 2.30 for prompt shipment; however, demand was improving as some interest shifted from whole breasts to cutlets. Legs, leg quarters and wings increased in availability and were often slow in clearing. Giblets were fully adequate to ample at current price levels.
