CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEANS CLOSED MIXED. LACK-LUSTER EXPORT DEMAND FOR WHEAT AND RAINS OVER LARGE PART OF MIDWEST, IMPROVED OUTLOOK FOR RECENTLY SEEDED WINTER WHEAT ARE FACTORS IN LOWER WHEAT PRICES. HARVEST DELAYS FROM RAINS AND CONTINUED LIGHT MOVEMENT OF PRESENT PRICES SUPPORTED CORN AND SOYBEANS IN THE MIDWEST. SOYBEANS FOUND SUPPORT FROM GOOD EUROPEAN DEMAND FOR SOYBEAN MEAL.
