recent export developments. Optimism continues to keep this pit fueled as we approach the long term grain agreement talks with the Soviets. The Crop report showed wheat total wheat production at 1.812 billion bushels as of October 1st which was up from the September 1st estimate of 1.810 billion bushels. Ending stocks were reported at 528 million bushels which compared with 536 million bushels on September 12th.

**ACRES CATTLE UPDATE:** Live cattle and feeder cattle closed higher this afternoon on advances in live cattle attributed to late buying as December broke through its previous contract high of \$74.95. Earlier strength was tied to short covering and cash connected buying in response to news of \$73.00 fed cattle prices in Texas. Feeder strength was attributed spill over from live cattle with gains limited by a decline in the last cash quote and the premium to cash index price.

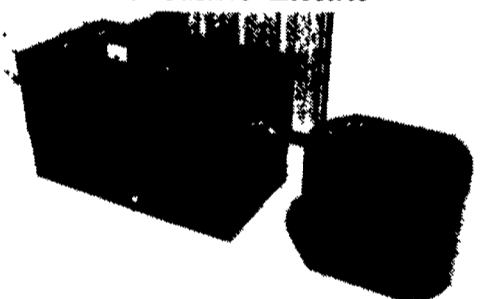
