

ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures settled higher today, gaining from 1/4 to 1-1/4 cents on buying fueled by bullish export news. Earlier gains were trimmed by profit taking in advance of today's report. News that the USSR bought 250,000 metric tonnes of corn opened the market higher along with firm cash basis levels. Today's crop report, termed bearish by the trade revealed increased production estimates for this year, while the ending stocks were within reason. ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures fell victim to profit taking and liquidation in front of today's USDA crop production report making session lows on the close. Trading was quiet throughout the day and confined to narrow ranges. Pressure was attributed to bearish weather news from Brazil. Support came from activity in the corn soyoil and wheat pits. November closed out at \$7.90-1/4 after trading to a high of \$7.95 earlier in the day. The Crop report was termed bearish by floor

traders and analysts and showed production up from 1.472 billion on Sept. 1 to 1.501 billion as of Oct 1st. Stocks also increased from 100 million bushels on Sept 12 to 125 million bushels on October 12. Beans are expected to open 3 to 10 cents lower tomorrow.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed mostly higher today gaining from 1/2 to 1-1/4 cents on the front three options. December traded up to its contract high and stalled in quiet trading. Short-covering on the close and light buying in advance of today's crop report boosted prices late on
