

Good Prices For Montgomery 4-H Market Lambs

CREAMERY (Montgomery) — In keeping with its reputation for quality and community support, Clemens Markets, represented by Al Kober of Lansdale, was the buyer of the grand champion animal at the annual Mont-

gomery County 4-H Market Lamb Sale held at the Perkiomenville Sales Auction. Chris Muse of Perkasio received \$3.75 per pound for the prize-winning lamb he raised as his 4-H project. The reserve champion lamb was purchased by

the Trolley Stop Restaurant in Skippack, represented by Mary Black also of Skippack. The Trolley Stop paid \$2.85 per pound for the 100-pound animal which belonged to Rob Nutt of Blue Bell.

Dean Shollenberger, representing Farm Credit of Silverdale, outbid all other to buy the champion pair of lambs belonging to Andy Kumpf of Norristown. They paid \$1.80 per pound for the animals, which each averaged 145 pounds. The successful buyer of the reserve champion pair was Wayne Marcho of Marcho Veal in Harleysville who paid \$1.35 per pound for the projects raised and exhibited by Dan Cochran of Collegeville.

Frank Fillipo of Norristown purchased lambs belonging to Sue Truehart of Norristown and Denise McMahon of Green Lane. Gary Kratz of Kratz's General Store in Creamery, was the buyer of lambs shown by Todd Frankfield of Royersford, Jim Nutt of Blue Bell, Andy Kumpf of Norristown and Jon Unruh of Harleysville. Clemens Markets also supported several members by purchasing animals exhibited by Sheila Landis of Green Lane and Jon Unruh, Harleysville.

Manieri Meats of Bechtelsville was the proud purchaser of the animal shown by Chris Muse while Royal Crest Meats of Trenton, New Jersey, was the buyer of Johanna Landis's lamb. 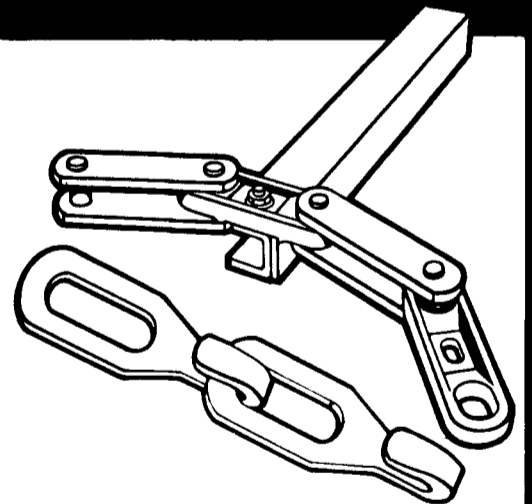
