-Take inventory now, locate extra sources early, maximize crop residues. Waiting until your inve tory is depleted is no time to buy. By that time, competition for

-Feed according to need. Use a two-feed system. Give your high producers top quality forage and feeds and feed your low producers a basic inexpensive

—Test feedstuffs -Balance Ration. During a good year it is important. During this year when com height and ear growth vary on the same farm, forage testing is your first stop on the road to better management.
