Travel books

For those who need to travel with small children, Sherry suggests compiling a travel activity

book. She fills zip lock plastic bags with items guaranteed to keep little fingers busy. The bags are fastened at the edges so they can be turned like the pages of a book. Each compartment holds items such as recycled greeting cards with holes punched at strategic points and yarn for threading through them; pipe cleaners to form stick people, puzzles fashioned from cereal boxes, pencils, paper, crayons, a magnifying glass and magnets.

Corn capsules

Sherry's humor shines through many of her projects. This year she created Christmas corn capsules, which are used as a Christmas countdown for children. The container spouts these words:

"How many days till Christmas? It's awfully hard to wait! So, Reach in the jar and pull out a roll
