CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES MIXED WEDNESDAY. SCAT-TERED SHOWERS OVER SECTIONS OF MID-WEST HELPED WHEAT GER-MINATION, BUT MANY PLACES VERY DRY; WHEAT NOT COMING UP AND TURNING YELLOW AND DYING. BUGS HROHF ROBLEM IN SOME AREAS. USDA RELEASED ITS **CROP PRODUCTION REPORT TODAY** SHOWING CORN FOR GRAIN PRO-**DUCTION FORECASTED AT 4.67 BIL-**LION BUSHELS, 34 PERCENT BELOW LAST YEAR'S CROP. SOYBEAN PRO-DUCTION IS 1.51 BILLION BUSHELS, 21 PERCENT LESS THAN IN 1987. SORGHUM GRAIN FORCASTED AT 546 MILLION BUSHELS, 26 PERCENT LESS THAN 1987. NO GOOD EXPORT NEWS TO BOOST CORN PRICES.
