HIGHER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$1.00 HIGHER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 5% BELOW A WEEK AGO BUT 3% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 14 POUNDS HEA-VIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-NIA WERE STEADY TO WEAK AS MIDWEST MEAT PRICES SHOWED DEMAND VERY WEAK. SLAUGHTER WAS 2% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 18% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 19 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.
