ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed mixed today losing as much as 120 points on the deferred October contrading and gaining 8 points on the February. Buying during the session was attributed to short covering and indications of oversold conditions. Bearish fundamental factors limited buying, with product prices declining and slaughter remaining at full capacity. Ideas that prices had reached a near term bottom encouraged some buying with selling late in the session linked to profit-taking. Bellies closed lower pressured by yesterday's bearishly construed cold storage report along with expecta-

tions for other hefty in movement of fresh product.






