Other CAAS committees include alumni relations chaired

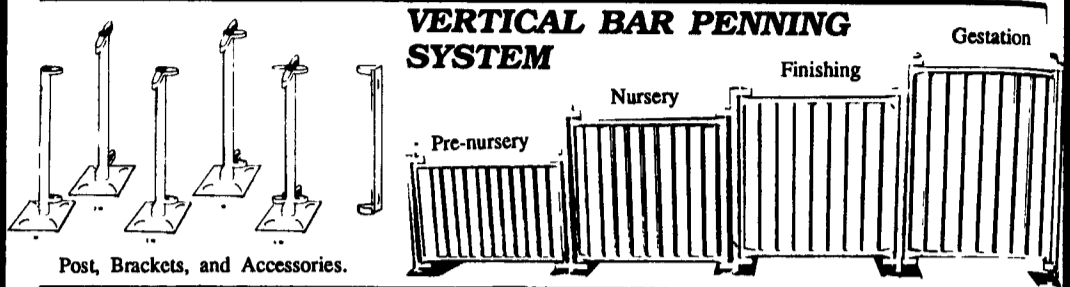
by Farmshine editor Dieter Krieg of Lititz; career counseling and placement, chaired by Penn State professor of animal science Harold Harpster, finance, chaired by

er of Palmyra; program, chaired by Bill Sheaffer of Beavertown; and student recruitment, chaired by Patty McMurray of Eighty Four.

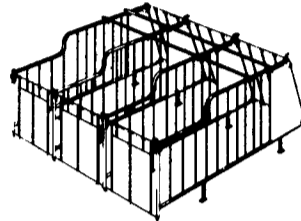
