## Cornell Extension Service Offers Soil Compaction Fact Sheet

ITHACA, NY — Soil compaction has become an increasing concern with the use of heavier agricultural machinery and more intensive cropping systems. Compaction is the reduction of soil pore space resulting from the compressive effect of heavy machinery and from the destruction of natural soil aggregates by excessive tillage.

To help farmers understand and correct soil compaction, a new Cornell Cooperative Extension fact sheet, "Soil Compaction: Causes, Diagnosis, Prevention and Correction," was written by Victor Snyder of the Department of Agronomy, New York State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Cornell University.

Compacted soil impairs plant root growth, requires higher energy for tillage, causes poor drainage, high runoff and erosion, reduces the capacity of soil to store water, increases plant disease occurrence and hampers seedling emergence.

The author identifies the causes of soil compaction, shows what it looks like and then tells how to minimize or correct compaction.

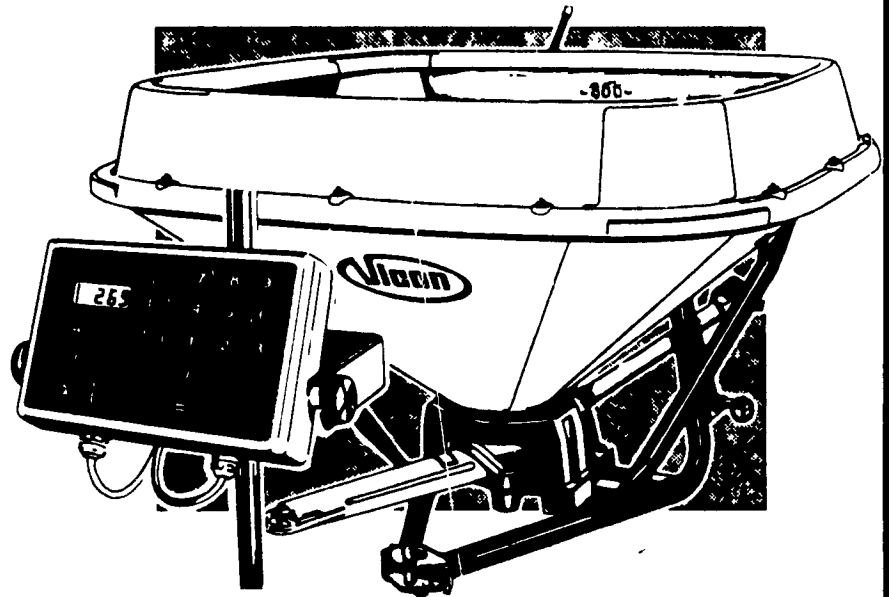
