MARKETS IN REVIEW: DEC. 1-7, 1988. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO WEAK.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS SOLD AT AUCTIONS IN VIRGINI-A \$1.00 LOWER WITH MIDWEST PRICES STEADY TO \$1.50 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00 LOW-**3R. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 20 PER-**CENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 2 'ERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 13 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN AST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-VIA WERE MOSTLY STEADY AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE ALSO STEADY. VEAL AND CALF SLAUGH-TER WAS 24% ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 6% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 21 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN

LAST YEAR. LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$2.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00- 4.00 LOWER. LAMB SLAUGHTER WAS 16% ABOVE A YEAR AGO BUT 3% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND LIGHTER THAN LAST YEAR.
