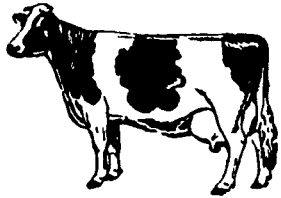

HARRISBURG — The Pennsylvania Beef Council, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association and the Pennsylvania Veal Producers Association, is currently accepting applications for the 1989-90 Beef Industry Representatives and Veal Ambassador's Programs.

The nine representatives selected, six Beef Industry Representatives and three Veal Ambassadors, will represent the Pennsylvania Beef Council at various consumer and producer functions, including health fairs, in-state retail promotions, county fairs and mall promotions. The representatives will be a reim-

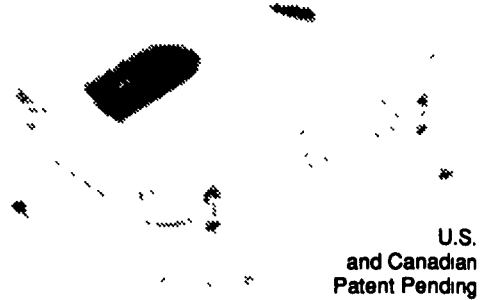
