CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEANS HIGHER. MARKETS SUPPORTED BY RECENT WHEAT PURCHASES BY CHINA AND INDICATIONS THE U.S.S.R. BIDDING ON 400,000 TONNES BEP WHEAT. CORN MARKETS QUIET, SUPPORTED BY STRONG SOYBEAN TRADING AND SHARPLY HIGHER SOYBEAN MEAL MARKETS.

UNITED STATES...LACK OF PRECIPITATION CONTINUED STRESSING WINTER WHEAT IN THE CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN PLAINS. LACK OF SNOW COVER CONCERNED WINTER WHEAT PRODUCERS IN PORTIONS OF THE CORNBELT AND NORTHERN PLAINS. LIVESTOCK WAS IN MOSTLY GOOD CONDITION. WESTERN USSR...A WARMING TREND DIMINISHES SNOW COVER IN THE WEST AND SOUTH. EASTERN ASIA...HEAVY RAIN FALLS ACROSS SOUTHEASTERN CHINA AND TAIWAN. SOUTH AMERICA...SOAKING RAIN IN BRAZIL IMPROVES CONDITIONS FOR CORN AND SOYBEANS. SCATTERED SHOWERS AND HOT WEATHER INCREASE STRESS ON SUMMER CROPS IN ARGENTINA.
