LOUISVILLE, KY — Kevin and Robin Martin, dairy farmers from Oxford, Pa., were among representatives of seven Dairymen, Inc. divisions participating in the Outstanding Young Dairymen Program during Dairymen's 20th Annual Meeting, Dec. 8-9 in Louisville, Ky.

Selected as the cooperative's overall Outstanding Young Dairymen were David and Linda Cox, representing the Old Dominion Division.

Dairymen, Inc. is a regional milk and dairy products marketing cooperative headquartered in Louisville, Ky. and is owned by more than 5,500 member-farmers in 17 mid-Atlantic, southeastern and midwestern states.
