
## Schlosser, Sollenberger Honored By Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association

### Footnotes:

1. The disease ratings for competitive varieties were checked against the "Alfalfa Varieties for '88" article which appeared in the November 1987 issue of the Hay and Forage Grower magazine. The ratings for PROCUT are shown as presented for the Plant Variety Protection Certificate and as presented to the Alfalfa Variety Review Board

HR = Highly Resistant R = Resistant
MR = Moderately Resistant
LR = Low Resistant S = Susceptible

- 2. The Disease Rating Index is a cumulative measure of a variety's disease resistance to the five diseases listed. For each disease that a variety is Highly Resistant to, it receives a rating of 5, Resistant to a 4, Moderately Resistant to a 3, Low Resistant to a 2 and Susceptible to a 1 rating The ratings are then added to determine the Disease Rating Index. A total of 25 would be ideal. The varieties in the chart with a shown for a particular disease were tabulated as a 1.
- 3. The Insect Ratings were taken from the same sources as described in footnote 2.
