with the February option closing 132 points lower at \$43.60 while the April lost only 78 points at \$43.07. Volume was relatively high with much of today's selling linked to the establishment of new short positions and cash fundamental weakness. Some buying near the close was tied to bottom-picking along with ideas the pit had become oversold today. Contract lows in February through April pork bellies were set today for the second consecutive session with price direction established by live hog weakness and declines in fresh belly prices.
