PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO LOWER ON LARGE AND EXTRA-LARGE IN THE MID- ATLANTIC, BALANCE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO STEADY. DEMAND AT ALL LEVELS WAS LIGHT TO OCCASIONALLY GOOD, MOSTLY MODERATE. SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE AND AVAILABLE WHEN SOUGHT. SHELL EGG OFFERINGS TO BREAKERS DECLINED DUE IN PART TO THE WIDE DIFFERENTIAL BETWEEN SHELL EGG AND BREAKING STOCK PRICES AND WHEN SPOT LOADS WERE TRADED, PRICES TRENDED HIGHER.
