FEEDER CATTLE AND CALVES \$1.00-\$3.00 HIGHER. SLAUGHTER COWS \$2.00 HIGHER. SLAUGHTER BULLS STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER. DEMAND GOOD FOR BOTH FEEDER AND SLAUGHTER CATTLE. YEARLING CATTLE COMING OFF OF WHEAT PASTURE CONTINUE TO FORM LARGE PERCENTAGE OF THE SUPPLY. FORCED TRADE FOR NUMBERS ON SHORT RUN OF COWS; HOWEVER THIS WEEKS PRICE UPTURN IS SUPPORTED BY HIGHER QUOTES ON DRESSED COW CARCASSES. OKALHOMA WEATHER HAS CHANGED: RAINS OVER THE STATE LAST WEEKEND RESULTED IN SHARPLY REDUCED NUMBERS AT THE AUCTION. THEN WEDNESDAY MORNING COLD BLEW IN FROM THE NORTH CANCELING OUR MILD WINTER. RECEIPTS THIS WEEK 8,200; LAST WEEK 15,296; LAST YEAR 12,130. CONSIST OF SUPPLY: 75% YEARLING FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS; FEEDER CALVES 19%; COWS AND BULLS 6%.
