

Virginia Weekly Richmond, Va. Thursday, January 26, 1989 WEEKLY REVIEW IN VIRGINIA. MARKETS IN REVIEW: JAN. 19-25, **1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS** IN VIRGINIA WERE MIXED, \$4.00 HIGHER TO \$3.00 LOWER AS MID-WEST PRICES WERE \$3.00-5.00 HIGHER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS IN VIRGINIA WERE UNEVEN, \$1.00 LOWER TO \$1.25 HIGHER AS **MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO** \$1.00 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$3.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$1.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 6 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 3 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 4 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-NIA WERE WEAK WHILE IN THE MIDWEST THE DEMAND WAS LIGHT AND TRADING SLOW. VEAL AND CALF SLAUGHTER WAS 5 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 5 PER-CENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVER-AGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 2 POUNDS HEAVIER.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$3.00 LOWER AS MID-WEST PRICES WERE \$2.00 HIGHER. LAMB SLAUGHTER WAS 3% ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 2% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

SLAUGHTER HOGS IN' VIRGINIA WERE \$1.00-2.00 LOWER AS MID-WEST PRICES WERE 25-50 CENT LOWER. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$5.00 LOWER. PORK PRODUCTION WAS DOWN 3 PER-CENT FROM A WEEK AGO BUT 6 PERCENT HIGHER THAN A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 2 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR


