MARKETS IN REVIEW: FEB. 2-8, 1989. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$2.50 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$1.50 HIGHER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE MIXED, \$5.00 HIGHER TO \$1.50 LOWER, MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00-2.50 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE UNEVEN, \$7.00 HIGHER TO \$1.50 LOWER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO 50 CENT

LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 2 PERCENT BELOW A WEEK AGO AND LESS THAN 1 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 17 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE MOSTLY \$3.00-10.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. VEAL AND CALF SLAUGHTER WAS 2 PERCENT BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 3 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE 75 CENT TO \$2.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY. LAMB SLAUGHTER WAS THE SAME THIS WEEK AS LAST WEEK BUT 3 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

SLAUGHTER HOGS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$1.00-2.00 LOWER AS MID-

WEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$1.00 LOWER. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE \$2.50-4.75 LOWER EXCEPT LOINS WHICH WERE \$1.50-2.00 HIGHER. PORK PRODUCTION WAS 1 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 8 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 2 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

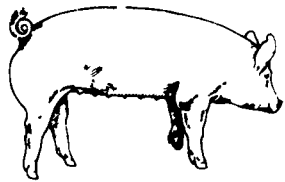
