## FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn futures settled from 1/4 cent lower to 1-1/4 cents higher today with strength late session tied to spillover from the soybean pit. News of increased farmer sales coupled with talk of improved weather both in Argentina and the United States pressured. The absence of export bonus bids from the Soviet Union served to keep gains in check along with ideas of adequate free stocks available to the pipeline. March closed today 1-1/4 higher at \$2.71.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybeans added to Tuesday's gains and ended today's session from 2-1/2 to 5-3/4 cents higher. Buying throughout the day was tied to

short covering with further support linked to an inflationary tone in the outside markets, namely platinum and the energies. Overall product strength served to underpin prices along with firm processor bids. November closed today at \$7.16-1/2, up 5 cents while the March gained only 3-1/4 cents and settled at \$7.3850. Trading today was fairly thin with prices confined to narrow ranges.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures prices began to strengthen today and closed from 1/2 cent lower to 1-3/4 cents higher as short covering late in the session fueled minor gains. New crop months were pressured by improved weather conditions in portions of the hard red belt with

...offsetting support coming from continued dry conditions in Kansas. News that Algeria was rebidding today under export bonus served to underpin prices as the market awaited further word from China and the USSR. July gained 1/2 cent and settled at \$4.08 while the September option lost 1/2 cent at \$4.13.

**ACRES CATTLE UPDATE:** Live and feeder cattle futures closed lower today on selling attributed to long liquidation in advance of tomorrow's USDA 7-State Cattle on Feed report. Losses in live cattle were from 5 to 40 points while feeders closed from 2 higher to 43 lower. Further pressure was linked to cash connected selling fueled by unprofitable

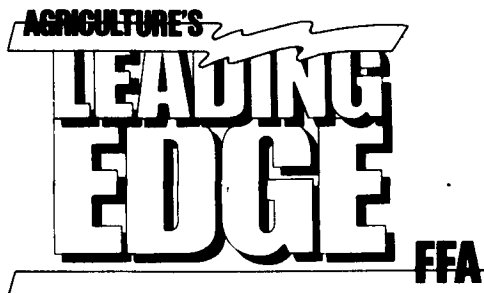
