CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES ALONG WITH FUTURES MARKET MODESTLY HIGHER WEDNESDAY. MORE MOISTURE, MOSTLY IN THE FORM OF SNOW, FELL OVER LARGE PART OF WHEAT AND CORN BELT, BUT DROUGHT FAR FROM QUELCHED. NO OUTSTANDING EXPORT THIS WEEK, DISSAPPOINTMENT OVER LACK OF WHEAT ORDERS FROM CHINA. SOYA COMPLEX CONTINUED TO RALLY AFTER WHAT SOME THOUGHT WAS OVERSOLD POSITION AFTER RECENT PRICE DECLINES.
