WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY COMPARED WITH LAST WEEK--STOCKER STEER AND STEER CALVES (LARGE SHARE OF WEIGHTS UNDER 650 LB.) STEADY TO FIRM; FEEDER STEERS OVER 650 LB. STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER. FEEDER HEIFERS AND HEIFER CALVES STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER, LARGELY STEADY IN LATE TRADE. STOCKER DEMAND GOOD. MODERATE TO GOOD DEMAND FOR FEEDLOT DESTINED CATTLE. BULK SUPPLY 650-900 LB. STEERS AND 500-800 LB. HEIFERS. VERY GOOD GAINS ON WINTER WHEAT PASTURE THIS YEAR; GOOD PERCENTAGE OF FEEDER OFFERINGS ARE FLESHY. WHEAT PASTURE CATTLE MARKETINGS EXPECTED TO BE HEAVY BEGINNING NEXT WEEK AND CONTINUE AS SUCH THRU MARCH. APRIL-MAY MARKETINGS EXPECTED LIGHTER THAN NORMAL. THIS PROBABLE CHANGE IN NORMAL MARKETING HABIT WOULD BE DUE TO POOR CONDITION OF SOME WHEAT PASTURES AFTER RECENT FREEZING WEATHER AND MORE FARMERS ANTICIPATING MAKING A GRAIN CROP RATHER THAN GRAZE-OUT.
