The meeting was called to order by Frances Greenawalt, vice president.

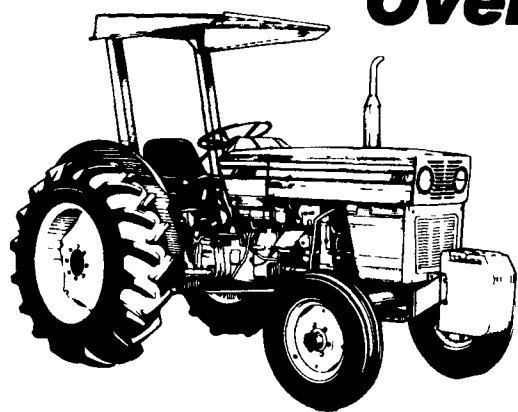

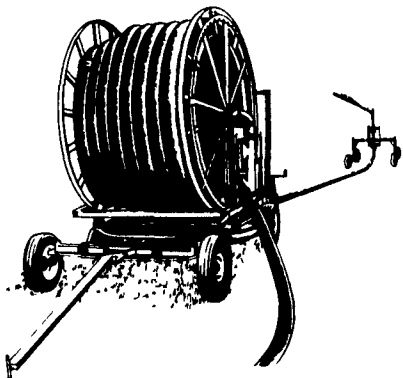
