FUTURES PRICES, CORN AND SOYBEANS ALSO POST-ED SUBSTANTIAL GAINS. SOYBEAN MEAL AND OIL PRICES HIGHER AND THE ADVANCES IN SOYA COMPLEX SUPPORTED OTHER GRAINS. FAIR EXPORT DEMAND, BUT NO WHEAT FOR U.S.S.R. UNDER EXPORT BONUS PROGRAM AS YET THIS WEEK. ANOTHER FEBRUARY ARCTIC FREEZE MOVING OVER LARGE PART OF THE COUNTRY TO FURTH-ER INCREASE LIVESTOCK FEED CONSUMPTION AND IMPROVE

DOMESTIC DEMAND. UNITED STATES...RAIN BENE-FITED WINTER WHEAT IN PORTIONS OF THE SOUTHERN PLAINS. SNOW COVER WAS MOSTLY ADEQUATE IN THE NORTHERN PLAINS. SMALL GRAINS WERE MOSTLY GOOD IN THE SOUTHEAST. SOME FLOODING OCCURED IN PORTIONS OF ARKAN-SAS, ILLINOIS, KENTUCKY, AND TENNESSEE. HIGHER TEMPERA-TURES EASED LIVESTOCK STRESS IN THE CORN BELT, PLAINS, AND WEST. WESTERN USSR...TEMPERATURES ARE UNSEASONABLY WARM FOR THE NINTH CONSECUTIVE WEEK, BUT WINTER GRAINS REMAIN DOR-MANT. EUROPE...MODERATE TO HEAVY RAIN RETURNS TO MUCH OF THE NORTHWEST. UNFAVORABLE DRYNESS CONTINUES ACROSS THE SOUTHWEST. EASTERN ASIA...HEAVY RAIN SATURATES SOILS AND CAUSES POSSIBLE FLOODING ACROSS SECTIONS OF THE YANGTZE VALLEY, SOUTH KOREA, AND JAPAN. SOUTHEAST ASIA...HEAVY SHOWERS OVER JAVA BOOST IRRIGATION RESERVES BUT LIKELY CAUSE LOC-AL FLOODING. SOUTH AMERI-CA...SHOWERS COVER ARGENTI-NA'S CROP AREAS BUT WARM WEATHER PERSISTS.
