FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE UNEVEN, \$2.00 LOWER TO \$8.00 HIGHER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00-2.00 HIGHER.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIFERS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$1.25 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$3.00-4.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE MOSTLY \$1.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 6 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 3 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 18 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 HIGHER. VEAL AND CALF SLAUGHTER WAS 9 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 2 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 3 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

LAMB PRICES IN VIRGINIA WERE \$8.00-9.00 LOWER LAST WEEK

WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$2.00 HIGHER. LAMB SLAUGHTER WAS 5 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 8 PERCENT ABOVE LAST YEAR. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

SLAUGHTER HOGS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO 50 CENT LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE MOSTLY STEADY. FRESH PORK PRICES WERE UNEVEN, \$5.00 LOWER TO \$2.00 HIGHER. PORK PRODUCTION WAS 3 PERCENT ABOVE A WEEK AGO AND 11 PERCENT ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE THE SAME AS LAST YEAR.

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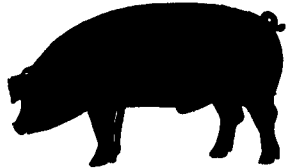

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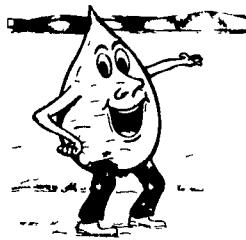
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
