NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were higher in the Northeast and Midwest, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was steady to firm. Demand was mixed, best where specials were active. Inquiry for the limited offerings of nest run and graded loose eggs was fair to fairly good and trading was at premium terms. Supplies were generally balanced. Breakers continued to cautiously purchase shell eggs as needed only at steady to higher prices. Live supplies of spent hens were adequate and most processors planned reduced schedules due in part to reduced buyer interest.

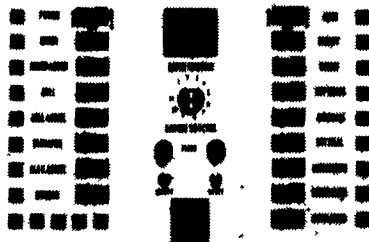
