

Lebanon County Holstein Club Annual Tour

This year's tour will be to Franklin County on March 16, 1989. The bus will be leaving the Fisher Bus parking lot at 7:30 a.m. and will return at approximately 6:30 p.m. Following is a list of the scheduled stops.

Alvin Meyers Farm: Meyers is currently milking 55 cows with a 19,309 lb. herd average and 739 lb. of fat. He has an BAA of 105.7 with 5 excellent cows.

Fred & Dale Rice Farm: The Rices are 1989 Pennsylvania Mas-

ter Farmers. They are milking 186 cows in a new double 10 perpendicular milking parlor. Their operation also includes a drive through a feeding barn and a step gravity flow system in the free stall barns.

Harold F. Crider and Sons Farm: The Criders have been doing ET work since 1981 and have done extensive merchandising with offspring. Currently they have a BAA of 105.3 with 10 Excellent cows and a 17,000 lb. herd average.

Oakleigh Farm: Ed and John Brake milk 117 cows which are currently averaging 21,000 lbs. of milk and 810 lbs. of fat. They are starting some ET work and have a BAA of 103.8.

200 Farmer-Delegates To Gather In Syracuse For Eastern Meeting

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — Eastern Milk Producers Cooperative will hold its semi-annual Delegate Meeting on Tuesday, March 14, at the Hotels at Syracuse Square in downtown Syracuse.

Over 200 farmer-delegates representing 3,200 farm families in nine states are expected to attend, according to the meeting organizer, Anthony Schlesier, who is manager of cooperative relations.

He said the delegates will meet in closed-door sessions all day to review the co-op's operations for the past year, to hear projections for the coming year, and to discuss policy direction for the co-op.

Eastern Milk is a leading North-

east dairy cooperative, with a high concentration of farmer-owners in New York, Pennsylvania and Vermont. The co-op also serves members in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland.

In 1988 Eastern marketed about 2 billion pounds of milk -- supplying raw milk to some of the largest cheese manufacturers in the country as well as an extensive list of regional fluid processors and product manufacturers.

Eastern also operates six dairy stores, and a truck route system for delivering an extensive array of products to 30,000 rural customers in a dozen states.

All hay will be sold by the ton and a nutrient test will accompany each load. Any and all size loads are welcomed. There will be a \$2 per load fee to help defray the cost of the NIR testing.

additional tanks were needed for storage and a new milk house was added onto the 1848 double-decker Quaker barn. Gracing this new facility was a used milk tank that was purchased from Pulitzer-prize winning author Pearl Buck's own dairy facility. For many years these tanks served Edwin's herd of 80 Holsteins, and a yield of 2,500 lbs. of milk per day - a highly productive herd in those days.

The barn and surrounding acreage are no longer bustling with a large herd of dairy cows, but the 80 year old Edwin still cares for several head of calves and replacement heifers. Asked about his advice for today's dairy farmer, Mr. Martin replied, "Always be sure that you can see your way clear in any business situation. What I mean to say is, don't go over your head and

always live true to your word. Dairy farming is an honorable business that I've been proud to call my own. Another thing they must treasure and protect is our farm land. Places like Misty Pines should never be just only about our past, but should always hold a place in our country's future."

One winner each from Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey was chosen for this award. Participating families were required to have a history of continuous agricultural operation on the original farm. Applicants were solicited through the farm press, the County Extension Services and the Century Farm program.
