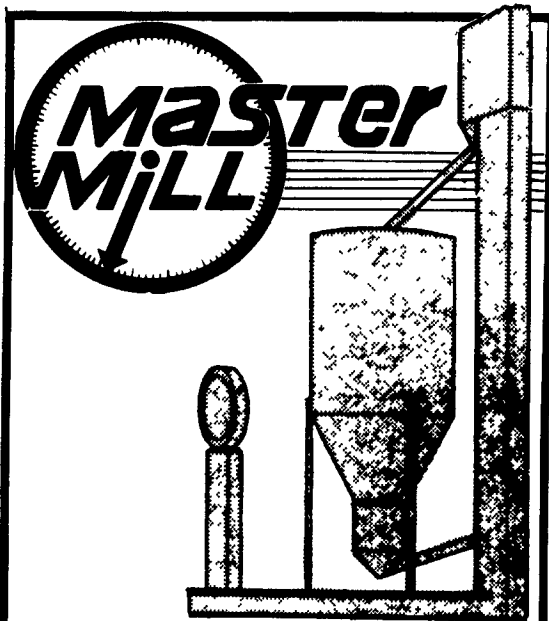

In the parts complex supplies of cutlets and wings were in close balance for the current buyer interest, while legs and leg quarters were more than adequate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 63-71 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average weights were mostly desirable. Slaughter schedules were moderately heavy. Trade sentiment was steady.
