CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES HIGHER WEDNESDAY, SECOND CONSECUTIVE DAY OF SUBSTANTIAL GAIN IN WHEAT PRICES. AT LEAST TUESDAYS SUPPLY AND DEMAND REPORT INCREASED ACTIVITY ON THE BOARD. DROUGHT CONDITION IN LARGE PART OF HARD RED WINTER WHEAT BELT ALSO A FACTOR. CORN HOLDING IN EXCESS OF WHAT SOME TRADE MEMBERS EXPECTED BUT RECENT DELUGE OF EXPORT ORDERS MAY IMPROVE THE SITUATION. MOISTURE OVER MOST OF SOYBEAN PRODUCING AREAS AND SOUTH AMERICAN HARVEST LIMITED REBOUND IN SOYBEAN PRICES AFTER RECENT DECLINES. EXPORT ORDERS FOR ALL COMMODITIES VERY FLAT THIS WEEK.

UNITED STATES...PRECIPITATION SLOWED FIELD WORK IN THE CORN BELT, DELTA, AND SOUTHEAST. SOIL MOISTURE WAS MOSTLY SURPLUS TO ADEQUATE IN THE DELTA AND SOUTHEAST AND MOSTLY SHORT TO ADEQUATE IN THE GREAT PLAINS AND MOSTLY ADEQUATE IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST. DAYS SUITABLE FOR FIELDWORK AVERAGED 2-3 IN THE DELTA, SOUTHEAST, AND CORN BELT AND 4-5 IN THE GREAT PLAINS AND THE WEST. WESTERN USSR...COOLER WEATHER PREVAILS IN THE NORTH WHILE MILD CONDITIONS IN THE SOUTH CONTINUE TO PROMPT EARLY GROWTH. WIDESPREAD VARIABLE PRECIPITATION COVERS THE REGION. EASTER!

ASIA...HEAVY RAIN AND POSSIBLE FLOODING COVER SECTIONS OF THE SOUTHEASTERN CHINA AND TAIWAN.
