**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn futures prices recovered today and closed from 1 to 1-3/4 cents higher on buying linked to short covering in response to oversold conditions. Further support was attributed to steady basis levels along with ideas that the Soviet Union would soon return to the market place. Mexico is scheduled to tender tonight for 120,000 metric tonnes. Prices were held in check by continued forecasts for increased rainfall during the next week with December settling today at \$2.61-1/4, up 1 cent.'Generic certificate bids firmed this morning by 1/2%.

ACRES SOYBEAN **UPDATE:** Soybean futures prices recovered today and ended the


session from 2-1/4 to 8 cents higher on buying linked to news that the Soviet Union was in the market for soyo il. Old crop ended the session 8 cents higher on reports that dockworkers would be on strike for an "indefinite" period. Further support was tied to light farmer sales. Large gains were pared by forecasts for continued rainfall over the next week. May settled today up 8 cents at \$7.40-1/2 while November closed 3 cents higher at \$7.10-1/2.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed from 1-1/2lower on the July and December options to 3-1/2 lower on the spot option. Selling initially was attributed to news that Egypt's second bid for export bonus had been

rejected. Further pressure was attributed to growing doubts that the USSR would be in a position to purchase in the near future. Reports prior to the opening that the hard red wheat condition was worse than expected underpinned. The weather patterns are still causing some confusion along with ideas that the U.S. may scale back its export bonus offerings.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live and feeder cattle closed mixed with live cattle closing from 5 lower to 5 higher and feeders from 33 lower to 5 higher.
