

PA DHIA Elects Officers For New Term

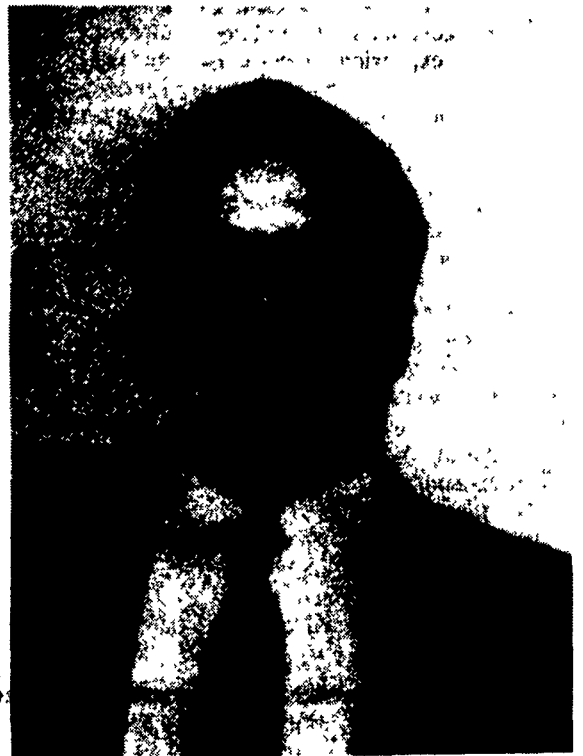

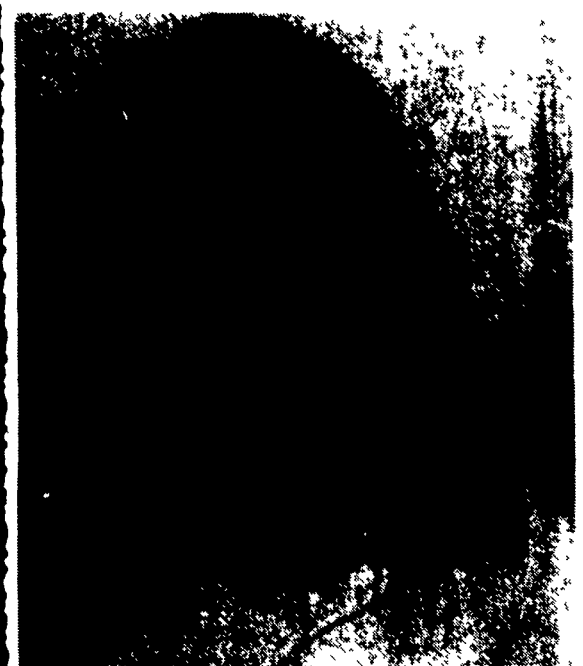
