ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Feeder and live cattle prices erased yesterday's gains with fats losing from 10 points to 110 points while feeders settled from 35 to 65 lower. Selling pressure was attributed to expectations for lower dressed beef and cut-out values along with light demand and slow movement. Additional selling was linked to a weaker tone in the fed cattle cash and beef markets. Feeders mirrored live cattle activity with further pressure linked to a slight slippage in the cash index.

ACRES NEXT DAY OUTLOOK: CASH - steady to weak FUTURES - steady to lower.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hog futures closed out today's session lower from 15 to 62 points after enduring session long pressure exerted by larger kill figures and weakening cash prices. Losses were compounded by weaker midday product quotes and spillover from sharply lower bellies. Short-covering late in the session boosted prices off session lows with today's closes at or near session highs. Losses in the July option were pared by the rolling

Penn State Sponsors Landisville Crops Day

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — The Penn State Crops Day at Landisville will be held June 21 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The event will be held at the Southeast Field Research Laboratory on Auction Road in Lancaster County, two miles northwest of Landisville.

This year's Crops Day will feature research and educational programs related to small grains and forage crops. Penn State Professor of Agronomy Dr. Elwood Hatley will chair the event.

The small grains programs will include a session on recently released and upcoming grain varieties such as Hercules and Pennunda spring oats and Pennco winter barley. Another section will focus on managing diseases like mildew, leaf rust and net blotch. There also will be sessions on nitrogen management for winter grains and the response of winter wheat varieties to row spacing and seeding rates.

Programs on forages will include discussions of alfalfa disease, alfalfa weed control, annual forages, nitrogen management and forage-ruining insects.
