IN VIRGINIA WERE MOSTLY \$2.00-4.50 LOWER WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$6.25-6.35 LOWER. SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-

ERS IN VIRGINIA WERE 25 CENT TO \$1.50 LOWER AND MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$3.25 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE 25 CENT TO \$4.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS LESS THAN 1% BELOW A YEAR AGO AND ABOUT THE SAME AS LAST YEAR. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 1 POUND HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.

**VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGINI-**A WERE \$1.50-8.00 HIGHER WHILE MIDWEST MARKETS HAD TOO FEW SALES TO QUOTE A MARKET. VEAL AND CALF SLAUGHTER WAS 3% HIGHER THAN LAST WEEK BUT 6% RELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 6 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR.
