NOTICEABLE INCREASE IN STOCKER WEIGHTS THIS WEEK. MOST CATTLE SHOWING GAUNT OR AVERAGE FILLS. FEEDER OFFERINGS IN MAY AND EARLY JUNE WELL SHORT OF YEAR AGO LEVELS. CATTLE HAVE CONTINUED TO GAIN VERY WELL WITH A GOOD SHARE OF THE SUPPLY OVER THE PAST SIX WEEKS WEIGHING BETWEEN 650-950 LB.
