ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures attempted a recovery, but failed with today's settlements lower from 3/4 to 2 cents. Commercial buying midday pushed prices higher despite forecasts for increased rainfall. Rumors that the USSR had

inquired into booking freight from the U.S. Gulf ignited ideas that they would also be seeking U.S. Corn. July traded in a 5-3/4 cent range today, settling 1-1/4 lower at \$2.65-1/2 after trading to a high of \$2.70-1/4. Trading in the July was active with pressure linked to

long liquidation and bear spreading. Bids for generic certificates were steady.

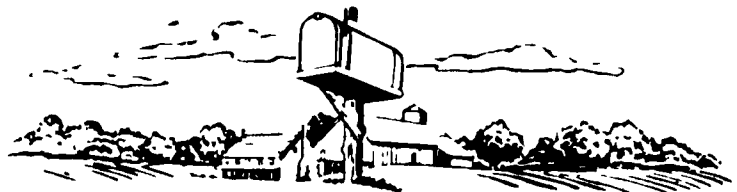
